SPRING GREETINGS FROM FORDINGBRIDGE SURGERY

Since January 2024 our local pharmacy can now see, assess and prescribe antibiotics for common conditions such as ear infections, infected insect bites, tonsilitis and urinary tract infections (UTIs) for women. AVON VALLEY PCN PHARMACY TEAM BY SALLY BUTTERWORTH, CLINICAL PHARMACIST

WHAT IS A PRIMARY CARE NETWORK (PCN)?

Since the NHS was created in 1948, our population has grown and people are living longer, many with long term conditions such as diabetes and heart disease or suffering with mental health issues. Since starting as a GP in 2004 patients need access to their local health services more often than ever before.

To meet these needs, Primary Care Networks were created in April 2019, just before the Pandemic. Ours is called Avon Valley PCN, and covers Fordingbridge Surgery, Cornerways Medical Centre (Poulner), Ringwood Medical Centre and Twin Oaks Medical Centre (Bransgore). The PCN has approximately 42,000 patients.

The principal aim is to group local GP practices together to deliver more proactive, personalised, and integrated health and social care for people, close to their homes. We also work hard to ensure your needs, as our patients, get prioritised within the regional healthcare system (Hampshire and the Isle of Wight).

As best laid plans often are, the development of the PCN was put on hold by the Covid Pandemic in March 2020. When the first covid vaccine became available in December 2020, it was decided by NHS England, that PCNs were best placed to deliver this campaign most effectively to all our eligible patients.

Many thousands of covid vaccines later, the PCN still plays a large part in delivering the Flu and Covid seasonal vaccination campaigns. The unexpected bonus was that the PCN, having worked together effectively for the first time during the pandemic, now started the real journey to deliver better services for you, our patients.

WHO ARE THE AVPCN PHARMACY TEAM?

We are fortunate in having both Pharmacists and Technicians already established and embedded in the practices who work closely together to improve medicines optimisation for all patients across the PCN. The Pharmacy team, pictured above, largely work from Ringwood Medical Centre, where we have a big office on the second floor.

Our team consists of the team lead Sally Butterworth who was the first member of the PCN pharmacy team in 2021 and is a clinical specialised who previously pharmacist in Psychiatry. There are two other pharmacists -Magdalena Mucha, and Sarah Willis-Owen who is an Independent Prescriber which means that she can prescribe medications for existing conditions within strict clinical guidelines but cannot diagnose new conditions. Heather Alderson is our Pharmacy Technician who has worked within primary care for almost 10 years. She specialises in the technical aspects of supplying medicines and medical devices to patients but is also trained to support the pharmacists in much of the clinical work. Our team is supported by Deborah Tuck, our administrator who leads on the High-Risk Drugs project, books patients in for discussion with the rest of the team, controls much of our workload and is a real asset to the team!

We also work closely with a team of pharmacists who are employed by 'Virtual Pharmacy' and who work alongside us carrying out certain pieces of work remotely.

WHAT DOES THE PHARMACY TEAM DO?

We are more than just tablet counters! The pharmacy team work together with all members of the surgery to ensure that medicines are used safely and appropriately, ensuring people get the right choice of medicines, at the right time, and are engaged in the process by their clinical team.

High Risk Drugs

We have a list of 65 medicines that require the person taking them to have careful monitoring of their bloods or their blood pressure/ weight. This may be to watch out for possible side effects, or to monitor the amount of that drug in someone's blood. Deborah runs this project and sends out letters and texts to remind patients to come in for these tests, thus enabling the doctors to prescribe the medicines safely.

DOAC checks

For all patients on a class of drugs called DOACs, which is a blood thinner, the pharmacy team perform a check after every blood test to ensure that the person is on the correct dose. This type of medicine needs to be dosed on age, weight and kidney function and so this is important to ensure we are prescribing it safely.

Meds reviews for clinic letters and discharges

The Virtual pharmacy team now review all letters that come from hospitals about a patient's medicines, whether this is an outpatient appointment or a discharge. They review the letters and add medicines to the repeat and ensure that medicines are stopped so that our records remain up to date. They may phone patients if they have been started on certain new medications to ensure they know enough about them.

Queries

Every day we support the practices with Medicines information support where the Health Care Professionals can contact us if they have a query about someone's medicines. This may be a quick question about availability and supply, or something that can take hours to resolve and may need an in-depth Medication review with the patient.

Medication reviews

Our pharmacists also carry out Medication Reviews, usually over the telephone, which is an in depth look at someone's medicines to see how they are getting on. We do this when requested by the GPs, or we can do a search and select patients on certain medicines, or certain combinations of medicines. This is done for people in care homes too.

CVD prevention work

The pharmacists and the technician run clinics every week to make phone calls to anyone who's had a cholesterol blood test which is high, or their risk of having a heart attack or a stroke is high, but they do not have any pre-existing heart conditions. Here we offer lifestyle advice, discuss their risks and what they can do to reduce this, alongside offering a medication called a statin which may be helpful. We hope to do a group education session on this soon.

The pharmacy team also carry out many more tasks including responding to medicines shortages and national safety alerts; carrying out audits to improve prescribing; implementing systems within practices to prevent over prescribing and improving safe prescribing; and working with the local ICB (Integrated Care Board) to ensure cost effective prescribing.



APRIL 2024 | ISSUE 4 **MEDICAL NEWS** COUCH TO 5K - A PATIENT'S STORY During a doctor's consultation. I received an PHARMACY FIRST!

During a doctor's consultation, I received an encouraging suggestion: why not participate in a Couch to 5K (C25K) course with a local running group? After more than a decade of inactivity and well into my fifties, I felt a mix of nervousness and excitement.

Contact was made, and a start date was set for the course. Initially, the idea of running for 60 seconds seemed like a monumental task, let alone the promise of 30 minutes by the end of nine weeks. On day one, I alternated between walking and running for short durations. To my surprise, I managed to move this somewhat dormant body at a pace faster than a walk—for a whole 60 seconds! Encouraged by the run leaders and sharing the experience with fellow C25K participants, we eventually completed the program with a park run, a satisfying 3.1 miles (5 kilometers).

Throughout this journey, I never felt judged by my peers. The only competition was with myself. Over the course of a year, I continued running, gradually building up to 6 miles (10 kilometers). Along the way, I shed an impressive 3.5 stones (22 kilograms) through careful adjustments to my calorie intake and continued exercise. But the benefits extended beyond weight loss—I gained lasting friendships within the running club and newfound confidence in my physical abilities.

From soothing an earache to treating a UTI, your local pharmacist can now provide medicines for seven conditions, if necessary, without the need for a GP appointment or prescription.

Community pharmacies can offer treatment for seven common conditions without patients needing to see a GP, as part of a major transformation in the way the NHS delivers care. Highly trained pharmacists at more than nine in ten pharmacies can now assess, treat and prescribe antiobiotics for patients for common conditions including earache, impetigo, infected insect bites, shingles, sinusitis, sore throat, urinary tract infections (UTIs) for women, without the need for a GP appointment. Available on the high-street, community pharmacy teams have the right clinical training to give people the health advice they need, with no appointment necessary and private consultations available. Community pharmacists will signpost patients to other local services where necessary. By expanding the services community pharmacies offer, the NHS is aiming to help free up GP appointments and give people more choice in how and where they access care. Don't wait for minor health concerns to get worse - think pharmacy first and get seen by your local pharmacy team.


ONLINE SERVICE: NHS APP

Patients can view and manage medication, view and cancel appointments, book blood tests and view your GP health record.

The NHS App also links to NHS111 allowing you to check your symptoms, and find other NHS services near you including dentists, pharmacies, urgent care services, hospitals, mental health services and much more. A recent addition within the NHS app service is the ability to register as a new patient with the practice, using the find services option.
